Grievance and Complaint Processes Available to Loyola University New Orleans Online Students

Loyola University New Orleans online students have access to all the grievance and complaint processes that Loyola on-campus students have. A student complaint can be filed electronically from each student's <u>LORA</u> account. Please note: <u>Grade Appeals</u> and <u>Academic Grievances</u> follow different processes. Academic grievance and complaint policies are found under Academic Regulations in the <u>University Bulletin</u>. The actual procedure will depend on the nature of the grievance or complaint.

Out-of-State-Online-Students

States operating under the <u>State Authorization and Reciprocity Agreement (SARA)</u> have agreed to allow their SARA state portal agency to investigate and resolve any complaints that have not been resolved through an institution's own procedures for resolution of grievances. Loyola is an approved SARA institution in Louisiana. As of 4/29/2017, only CA, FL, and MA are not SARA states.

If you are a Loyola online student and live outside of Louisiana in a state currently participating in SARA www.nc-sara.org, and you are unable to resolve a complaint with Loyola, or you feel that not all issues were resolved with the final disposition, you may appeal to the Louisiana Board of Regents.
