Chi Sigma lota Eligibility

Students are invited to join CSI during the Fall and Spring Semesters. Consideration is based on the following criteria from our chapter by-laws:

- 4.1 The following shall be deemed eligible for membership in the Society through endorsement of their chapter:
 - 4.1.1 <u>Students</u>: Those students who are enrolled in a counselor education program leading to graduate degrees (Master's, specialist, or doctorate).
 - 4.1.1.1 They shall have completed the equivalent of at least one full academic term (semester or quarter) of counseling courses carrying approved graduate credit as defined by the institution and are deemed promising for endorsement as a professional counselor whose ethical judgment and behavior will be exemplary.
 - 4.1.1.2 They must have maintained an overall scholastic grade point average of 3.5 or better (on a 4.0 system), or the equivalent, while enrolled in the program.

Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR) is a psychotherapy treatment that was originally designed to alleviate the distress associated with traumatic memories. During EMDR the client attends to emotionally disturbing material in brief sequential doses while simultaneously focusing on an external stimulus. Therapist directed lateral eye movements are the most commonly used external stimulus but a variety of other stimuli including hand-tapping and audio stimulation are often used. Shapiro (1995) hypothesizes that EMDR facilitates the accessing of the traumatic memory network, so that information processing is enhanced, with new associations forged between the traumatic memory and more adaptive memories or information. These new associations are thought to result in complete information processing, new learning, elimination of emotional distress, and development of cognitive insights. www.emdr.com>

DSM 5 WEBINAR OVERVIEW

Chi Sigma Iota (CSI) regularly hosts counseling related webinars for their members. Topics include school counseling, ethical issues and profession advocacy. Additionally, for active members who are also practicing clinicians, these webinars can be used toward Continuing Education Credits.

CSI's most recent webinar was "Diagnosis with DSM 5 and ICD" presented by Dr. K. Dayle Jones, Ph.D, LHMC. It aired live on June 11, 2013. This presentation helped to answer many questions raised with the arrival of the DSM 5. As a courtesy, we broadcasted the live webinar for our department, but in case you missed it, I wanted to highlight a few important points.

- DSM 5 is working away from categorical classification and toward dimensional classification, viewing diagnoses on a continuum as opposed the presence or absence of a diagnosis.
- The childhood disorder section was removed. This was done to reduce confusion of such diagnoses being misunderstood as only childhood disorders.

- Substance Abuse & Dependence were combined to Substance Use and include "craving" symptom.
- Gambling Disorder has been added.
- Phobias no longer exclude children.
- Dysthymia is now Persistent Depressive Disorder.
- PTSD is more explicit of "trauma" definition.
- Autistic Disorder, Asperger's Disorder and Childhood Disintegrative Disorder now fall under the single diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)
- Multi-axial Diagnosing has been removed.
- V-codes are now termed Z-codes.
- GAF scoring has been eliminated.
- By October 2014, <u>all</u> healthcare coding will switch to ICD 10 coding. DSM 5 has included ICD 10 codes for each diagnosis.
- It is recommended that clinicians use whichever DSM edition their facility requires.
