It would be beneficial for the student and the site if the student only had to take one lecture course along with practicum and was done with all lecture courses by the time he or she reaches internship. I've met students who plan to take up to 2 lecture courses with each semester of internship, which puts a heavy burden on the students time, but also means the student has not yet been exposed to valuable education in the classroom (on systems theory, family therapy, play therapy, etc) that he will likely need during his internship. It would be helpful if there was a mandate that X number of lecture classes be completed before beginning practicum and internship (when I was in school it was ALL classes!).
