The student intern was not very self motivated to bring or share ideas. The intern was pleasant to work with but throughout the entire school year, had to be given instructions for all tasks, groups, life skills class lessons, etc. instead of taking the opportunity to come up with some of her own ideas for lessons, or bringing any new information or ideas to me.
