### DESCRIPTION OF THE LIM EXTENSION PROGRAM

The Extension Program of the Loyola Institute for Ministry (LIM) offers college-level education (for certificate credit), which seeks to increase participants' theological knowledge, pastoral ministry competencies, and grounding in Ignatian spirituality. This program began as a response to Vatican II's emphasis on baptism and its invitation to all the baptized to respond to the call to ministry whether in the Church or the world. Participants form a learning community and meet in three-hour weekly sessions led by a Loyola-trained and certified facilitator. Students must be highly motivated to engage in critical reflection on course assignments, their faith, and their experience of living that faith out in the Church and world. In this program, the students are seen as central to the learning process and must take responsibility for their own learning. All participants must be highly motivated to reflect on their ministry and to engage in critical thinking about themselves and their ministry contexts. Students who successfully complete these courses receive credits called "continuing education units" (CEU) that lead to a CEU Certificate in Theology and Ministry from Loyola University New Orleans.
