The Loyola Institute for Ministry (LIM) has a 45-year history of educating adults in practical theology on six continents. Our method involves a rhythm of action and theological reflection. It prepares leaders who announce the Gospel and who are informed by a vision of the Catholic tradition that emphasizes its transformative potential.

LIM's approach **includes Ignatian spiritual formation and a strong theological core** complemented by focus courses in ministry and religious education. The program also includes the development of theologically sound and practical ministerial skills leading to professional competency. LIM emphasizes leadership and communication skills. It promotes a broad vision of ministry, which holds that it is practiced in explicitly ecclesial contexts—in churches, schools, dioceses, and beyond—wherever people of faith live and work.

The Institute inaugurated degrees and certificates in its Extension format (also known as LIMEX) in 1983. At the invitation of dioceses around the world, it began to offer its programs face-to-face in learning groups which are guided by a Loyola-certified facilitator. Full-time Loyola faculty also interact directly with students.

The Institute launched online courses in 2000 and its full online program in 2010. For increased flexibility, it has combined face-to-face distance learning with online learning by establishing LIMFlex, in which students begin their studies in learning groups and complete them online.
